

It's time to enjoy the weather and spend time with family and friends but with the dog days of summer come many seasonal risks.

As the weather heats up, our guard goes down. Pools are open, grills are fired up, kids are home - if you're not careful, accidents can occur. Keep these summer insurance tips in mind as you're soaking up the sun.

Pools: Did you know that in order to be compliant with insurance requirements, you must have a fence around your in-ground or above-ground swimming pool? Not having a fence is considered negligence, and in the event of an accident, it's likely that your claim will not be paid if you don't have this safety feature.



equipment, don't forget to notify your Waldo insurance agent and make sure everything is properly covered. Be sure that you are properly licensed, avoid reckless driving and stay safe by wearing a helmet, long sleeves and pants. Most importantly, make sure that your children only ride age-appropriate ATVs. There are different sizes and categories of vehicles with varying speeds and capabilities. The safety label affixed to the ATV will clearly state the age restrictions.

### **Barbeques & Grills:**

Your homeowner's policy will usually cover damage to your covered structures if you do experience a grill fire. You'll be required to pay up to your deductible, so small fires that cause only minor damage might not warrant submitting a claim. If you are a renter, check your lease. Many apartments/rental properties prohibit the use of grills or hibachis. A grill fire that damages your apartment won't be covered by your renter's policy if it was used in violation of your lease.

\$140 - school supplies

\$300 – electronics/computer equipment

The average planned back-to-school spending per household in the United States has gradually increased year-on-year to reach about \$865 in 2022. This is an increase of over 360 dollars since the beginning of the survey period in 2004.

College Students & Insurance What do I need to know as a parent?

Is your student living in the dorms this year? Check with Waldo Agencies to see if your homeowners policy extents

coverage to the dorm room. Many homeowners' policies exclude liability coverage in dorms.

Is your student living off campus in a shared apartment, condo or home? Consider renters insurance as a parent's homeowners' policy may not provide coverage of the student's property.

Does your student have a vehicle for college? Contact Waldo Agencies to make sure your coverage is up to date and includes your student on the policy as well as their age as that makes a difference in coverage. Also, talk to your student about lending their car while at school. There may be special coverage considerations to think about as sometimes other drivers not on the policy are not covered.

### Conversely . . .

If your college student does not have a vehicle at college, you will still want to make sure they are covered while

driving a friend's automobile while at school.

Hint: Your student needS to be listed on your auto policy.

The word "frankfurter" comes from Frankfurt, Germany, where pork sausages in buns are said to have been served in the 15<sup>th</sup> century.

### **AUSTRIA?**

"Wiener" is from Vienna (Wien), home to pork sausages originally called "wienerwurst" (Vienna sausage) in the 1800s.

### **UNITED STATES?**

In the United States, a German immigrant named Charles Feltman is credited with selling sausages in rolls around 1870

in Coney Island, N.Y. Another German native, Antonoine Feuchtwanger, is said to have sold sausages in St. Louis at around the same time, offering a split bun to hold them at the

suggestion of his wife.



### What about the term "hot dog" itself?

That's similarly shrouded in mystery. According to one of the more popular tales, a newspaper cartoonist in 1900 drew a picture of a frankfurter with legs, a tail, and a head, but unable to spell "Dachshund," dubbed it a "hot dog."

The story is disputed, however. What's beyond doubt is that hot dogs are the meal of choice for lots of hungry people around the world - whatever condiments (or Molly's Mills) they load them up with.
